Oregon High School Equestrian Teams

The Oregon High School Equestrian Team competition and program supports, challenges, and offers recognition to the dedicated teenagers who both physically and mentally pursue the sport of equine competition. This program will help students develop lifetime skills, teamwork, and self-discipline.

The program was formed in 1993, in Southern Oregon. Now as a statewide program, it runs throughout high schools as a winter/spring sport with three main competitions, two of which the athlete must compete in to be eligible for the state championship competition. Those athletes who are eligible and qualify at their district may compete in a state championship meet with competition against all district winners.

Athletic or activity letters may be awarded to athletes meeting the lettering requirements.

Each athlete pays a participation fee to his/her district to cover the costs of competitions, hiring of officials, insurance, etc. All other costs of transportation, stalls, equipment, team shirts and lodging are the responsibility of each athlete. Teams are encouraged to hold fundraisers to offset expenses.

Students are encouraged to organize their school equestrian team at the beginning of the school year in order to obtain administrative approval, canvas their school for members, hold regular meetings, organize fundraisers, and design and order their team shirt, before competitions begin.
