

## **OHSET STATE BOARD MEETING MARCH 28, 2010**

### **In Attendance**

We have 13 votes today so we have a quorum. There was some discussion about what makes a quorum – according to our by-laws it is 8, which doesn't seem to be very many out of a membership of 24. Maybe it should include some requirement about how many districts are represented as well as a minimum number.

### **Minutes from February Meeting**

There were no corrections. It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes from February 13, 2010. Approved unanimously.

## **REGULAR BUSINESS**

**Code of Conduct Signs** – Unfortunately, we're still waiting for these.

### **Insurance**

We need to create a way to report every accident that happens, whether it involves an ambulance or not. Karissa will be creating a simple form that can be filled out online – things like what was the cause of the accident (was the rider over-mounted, was there a coaching issue, unsafe horse, etc.).

- Peggy suggested we also include which event the accidents occur during.
- Donna brought up the challenge of who decides whether or not an athlete can ride a particular event. Candi said that for the protection of the organization, we HAVE to have coaches who are willing to make these decisions. Maybe we need to create some more specific guidelines so that it's very clear that coaches can and must decide if athletes are competent for the various events.
- Phil brought up the concern that collecting data may create more liability issues. Candi said that that's true, but we need to collect this data to improve our safety record, to show that we are concerned about the safety of our athletes, and to keep a record of incidents that may involve insurance issues.
- Lee said that there were accident report forms to fill out from early on in this organization and coaches and advisors should already be doing this.
- Phil said maybe we need to have a document that coaches/advisors need to sign that shows what responsibilities they are agreeing to.
- Donna said we do need to make a lot of changes in how we train our coaches or what we expect of them, but maybe we need to save that discussion for another time,

because it will take a lot of time. Candi said she had been thinking about breaking apart the coach's clinic from the judge's clinic, and maybe we could move the coach's clinic to the valley where more people are located. The consensus was that we would like to try this - maybe hold a coach's clinic in the Eugene area and keep the judge's clinic in Redmond where we get the facility at no charge.

### **Tour of Klamath County Fairgrounds**

- Discussion following tour:
  - The consensus seemed to be that the facility could handle the event, but that it would be tighter and less convenient than other places we have held state meets.
  - Chris said her objection isn't the facility, but it's coming to Southern Oregon for 4 years in a row. Others said it's not so much being in the Southern Oregon four years in a row, but driving the distance four years in a row.
  - Candi reminded everyone that we considered several options at the last meeting and the board voted to have it here.
  - This facility is considerably cheaper, but there would be other expenses because we would need to bring in equipment. Still, Candi said she thinks when all is said and done, this facility will cost us less. But that's not the only consideration.
  - Dawn said if we do it four years in a row in Southern, some athletes will never get to compete in Redmond which they seem to think is the best facility. Could we switch the 2013-2014 contract in Redmond to 2011-2012? Candi said we probably could but she doesn't know if that's the way we want to be known for doing business.
  - Chris suggested going to Redmond 2011 and Klamath in 2012.
  - Bill suggested using Salem for one year. It would be more expensive, but Klamath would be less.
  - Laurie suggested we could add another day to the state meet and use Salem without the event center.
  - Donna said the facilities management at Redmond seems to be the easiest to work with, Central Point is more challenging, and Salem is probably the most challenging.
- Donna moved to change the site of the state championship meet to Redmond for 2011-2012. Phil seconded. Discussion:
  - Peggy said she doesn't think any district should have home court advantage 4 years in a row.
  - Dawn pointed out that some school state events always happen in the same place every year? Peggy said yes, but those facilities are not where any particular team practices and plays for the rest of their season.
  - Several people said that they never have a state meet in their home facility and they don't mind. They pointed out that the home district hasn't won the state meet in a long time.

- Chris amended motion to hold the state championship meet of 2011 in Redmond, 2012 somewhere in Southern District. Motion was seconded by Phil. Vote: 6 in favor, 5 opposed, 2 abstentions, motion fails.
- Don amended to hold the state championship meets for 2011, 2012, and 2013 in Redmond if we can get out of the contract for 2014, and then go somewhere else in 2014-2015, and if we can't get out of 2014 contract, we'd go all 4 years to Redmond.
  - Discussion – Candi said dates are available. Vote on amendment: 8 in favor, 3 opposed, 2 abstentions; amendment passes.
- Vote on original motion by Donna, as amended by Don: 9 in favor, 1 opposed, 3 abstentions; motion carries.
- Candi will work with Redmond to see if she can negotiate the change. And she will negotiate with Klamath to pay for today's meeting as they didn't charge us because they were expecting a contract.
- Final Note – Several board members said that their schools are very willing to come to Klamath at some time in the future, just not after two years in Central Point.

### **National Youth Horse Leaders Symposium**

- See Candi's summary. See Attachment 1 at end of these minutes.
- People thought the idea of sending youth would be great. Maybe take two sophomores so they could give back to the organization during their junior year. They get pretty busy during their senior year.
- It will be in Michigan next year which is the other state that has a well-developed high school equestrian program. They've been going 30-40 years longer than we have. Bill said it's more performance based, with a short season in the fall. No uniforms, athletes where traditional show clothes. However, we could learn from their state organization, their infrastructure.
- We think we could contribute a lot to other states who may want to set something up. The consensus was that we would like to pursue sending representatives next year, and to possibly have them do a presentation about OHSET at the convention.

### **Judges Evaluations**

- Be sure to let JoAnn know who is judging all of your meets.
- Please submit judges evaluations. We are just getting ready to start the planning of the 2010 training, and those evaluations tell us what we need to cover.

### **How are meets going?**

- Ray asked if they need to be writing down all the back-up times? There was some discussion about this. The final consensus was that there should be at least two people from different schools writing the official times and then giving these to the announcer.

The back-up timer is only needed if the electronic timer fails or if there is a district or state record, in which case the back-up timer must be within a few seconds of the electronic timer. Candi asked if Phil would write up an SOG about this. He agreed.

- Dawn asked about a girl who did not compete in meet one, competed in two riding events at meet 2 then got sick, and now the horse is lame. For the third meet, she would like to use the horse in an in-hand event, but our rules don't allow this since the horse has already been in riding events. Does this request for an exception go to their district stewardship committee or to the state board?
  - Karissa gave three options –
    - the athlete rides without any permission for an exception, which adds to event total and increases the number entered in that event for the district which could affect the number of state meet qualifiers
    - or gets permission from the district stewardship committee and is able to compete in the event as a “phantom” handler, getting scored by judges, but not being part of the event, so no points toward state, and she would not increase the number entered in that event for the district
    - or she could borrow another horse and do this event or others
  - Consensus was that if it could in any way impact the state championship, it should come to state board; if there would be no impact at state level it, should be handled at the district level.

### **Parades**

Dawn said that one of her teams would like to ride in a parade, and is willing to pay extended insurance.

- LouAnn has indicated that, contrary to what we have been told in the past, our insurance will cover parades, if teams get a one-day added coverage.
- However, OHSET rules are that we don't allow parades.
- Phil said if it's against our rules, we shouldn't be changing rules in the middle of the year.
- Candi said an exception to a rule can be requested of the state board. Laurie said she thinks it would be good for promotion.
- It was pointed out that teams can ride on floats, just not on horses.
- Peggy said you can be creative with stick horses.
- Chris said this risks increasing our insurance rates – it's very risky and dangerous for our athletes. And we need to stick to our policy of no parades and trail rides on OHSET time.
- Donna asked about 4H. 4H does allow parades, but we shouldn't assume that it's okay just because they do it.
- No motion was made to make an exception.

### **Setting aside some district records in Northeast**

Phil explained what happened. In summary, when Northeast district changed facilities, they felt that the previous facility allowed such fast times in the timed events that they would be unfairly difficult to beat in the new, slower facility. Because setting a district record is an automatic

qualification for the state meet, Northeast felt that their athletes would now be at a disadvantage in that they wouldn't have that option of qualifying for state.

- Phil moved to set aside the Clackamas County records in question. Chris seconded it.

Discussion:

- Karissa said all arenas have different conditions. There are none that are the same. Even in the same arena conditions vary and can make it easier on one day to set a record.
- Vote on Phil's motion: 2 in favor, 11 opposed, 0 abstentions; Motion fails
- Phil asked about whether or not we do this retroactively, as he is aware that another district did this several years ago. Candi said she thinks we need to move on from this point.

## **STATE MEET UPDATE**

### **Settling Cattle**

- Candi presented a draft of a procedure for the state meet. See Attachment 2 at end of these minutes.
- Chris said if we're using Matt's cattle, they know their job.
- Phil said it isn't necessary if the cattle know their job. Donna said it will help make everyone happy because we are following a routine procedure. This is the way the "industry" settles their cattle.
- Candi suggested that we not think of this as what to do with Matt's cattle, but what to do with any cattle, particularly cattle we don't know about. It's always good to have a consistent procedure.
- Chris moved to accept this for the state meet. Phil seconded it.
  - Discussion - It doesn't take very long. It would make everyone happy, or at least give the complainers one less thing to complain about with team penning.
  - Vote: 13 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions
- Further clarification on the procedure:
  - Athletes cannot participate in settling the horses.
  - Can it be athletes' horses? Consensus was that adults on athlete's horses could participate in settling the cattle. These people would have to be OHSET registered volunteers.

### **Electric Eye for Team Penning**

- Donna explained that it's very difficult to turn the electronic eyes on and off at exactly the right time during team penning. She recommended we use the electronic timer but not the eyes, and just manually start and stop from the electronic timer. We also need two people running a back-up stopwatch.

- Chris moved that we follow this procedure for the State Meet and that we encourage districts to follow it at district meets. Phil seconded the motion.
  - Vote: 13 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions.

### **Flooded Stalls at State**

Let Jim or Jon know if something like this happens again and they'll move you. They were unaware of the problem last year. There will be extra stalls.

### **Golf Carts**

- Individuals can bring their own golf carts.
- What about gators? Discussion - They're noisier. They're very close to ATVs. Where will we draw the line? Jon suggested we limit it to golf carts for district chairs and people with handicaps. If we do limit this, it may not be worthwhile for the vendor we've arranged.
- The consensus was that we allow whoever wants to rent one to do so, but only a licensed driver may drive them.
- It was suggested that we may need to create a registration system so we know who is driving them if there is a problem. But, they haven't been a big problem before, so we probably don't need to create extra rules until we see that they are a problem.

### **Dogs**

Dogs weren't supposed allowed in the indoor arena last year and they kept announcing it, but people kept ignoring it, so finally they just gave up and allowed dogs. What do we want to do this year? Jon said people ignore the rule and he thinks it's impossible to enforce. Lee suggested getting a volunteer group (like a 4H club) to enforce this and we can make a donation to their club. Everyone thought this was a good idea and Candi will check on it.

### **Rooms for volunteers**

Candi asked if it's okay to cover room cost for various officials that have to be at the state meet. Consensus was that this is okay for her to arrange.

### **Rockers and Patches**

Karissa has ordered these and they'll be available by the state meet.

### **Silent Auction**

- In the past, each district has brought a basket with stuff representative of their region to auction off as a fund-raiser.
- The question was raised about whether or not to continue this as it does not seem to be a worthwhile money-maker. Districts may spend more filling their baskets than what is brought in from the sales.

- Candi will check with Sheri Smith about this. She has organized it in the past.

### **Big R / Wrangler Sponsorship**

- Candi has been in contact with these folks but they're not the same people we've dealt with in the past, and there seems to be a lack of awareness from the current personnel about what's been done in the past. Candi is meeting with them later this week, so hopefully some details will be worked out.
- Candi would like to designate one day of the State Meet as a "Tough Enough to Wear Pink" Day, in support of Breast Cancer Awareness. This is a Wrangler slogan, so she'll talk to them about it. The consensus was that this is a good idea. Some related ideas might be to provide pink bandanas and allow athletes to wear them around their necks for that day, or to sell them cheaply and give the proceeds as a donation to breast cancer. Wrangler sells them on their website.

### **Cattle for Different Events**

Candi said it's very important that we have different cattle for team penning than we do for roping and daubing. Matt said he can arrange that.

**National Anthem Draw** – Northeast was selected to provide someone to sing the national anthem; the runner up is TriRiverValley, if NE cannot find someone.

### **Grand Entry**

Donna will send an email to everyone requesting that we send her names of all our flag carriers and seniors. Please do this promptly so information can be compiled and ready for the announcer.

### **Judges**

- Candi provided a tentative judge list for state (See Attachment 3 at the end of these minutes).
- Chris brought up the concern of not having people with some connections to teams. Candi said she hoped our judges would be professional, but she recognizes that there is an image issue. Consensus was that these judges are ones that for the most part are getting the best evaluations and are being used in the meets. We want the best judges at the state championships.

### **Drill**

- Donna asked if we could synchronize the warm-up time a little better so the event runs more smoothly. Last year, the warm-up times were longer than the performance times, so the audience had to wait for some teams to finish their warm-ups and start their performance. It was the consensus that we need to do this, by making the practice times more equal to the performance times.

### **Attachment 1 - National Youth Horse Leaders Symposium, March 18-21, 2010 Lexington, KY In review....**

#### **Cost to OHSET**

- Total Cost, near \$1,900; including 1 plane ticket, conference fees, annual membership, and associated expenses.

#### **Things learned, discussed, benefits, etc.**

- Attended a 2 workshops regarding risk, after discussion and inquiry, in Oregon, because we have the inherent risk law, if we are not negligent, we're likely to be protected in the end...The top 4 things that are considered negligent and would cause us a lawsuit loss are:
  - Improper Supervision
  - Horse & Rider Misfits – riders over-mounted
  - Tack Failure, if we provide or adjust incorrectly
  - Allowing vicious horses to participate – behaviors are rated
    - Biting
    - Kicking
    - Striking
    - Rearing
    - Bucking
    - Etc.
  - We also have a volunteer protection law – if schools are paying coaches, then a whole other issue could arise.
- Attended workshop about youth demographics in the horse industry
  - See hand outs from AQHA/Ward Stutz
  - Discussion on how to reach a bigger audience
  - Recruiting to OHSET; How young should we look?
    - Get presence of mind in young adolescents much like traditional sports.
    - Mentor program.
    - No Child too young..... JMH, Horse Back Riding program, Advancement.
- Attended workshop on Event planning, tips of the trade.
  - Working with local CVB (Convention Visitors Bureau)
  - Hotel Contracts: do's and don'ts
    - No Minimums
    - Same price regardless of occupancy
    - Attrition Clauses-Yes! General number on contract but final 30 days out

- Free meeting space
  - Free room nights
  - “Points” programs: plane and hotel, purchases

  - Do an annual safety clinic, maybe put together curriculum...

- Basic skills in order to do timed events, team pen, etc.
- Maybe an online safety test required for athletes to complete or coaches, or ?
- May need to consider a minimum requirement that coaches witness riding skills before meets or ?
- Great discussion with college reps that were present.
  - University of Louisville
  - University of Kentucky
  - Georgetown University

#### Things we may want to consider for next year

- Attending AND Presenting on starting a high school equestrian organization
- I think youth could benefit – maybe offer a couple of \$500 scholarships and conference fees for them to attend?
- The networking possibilities are awesome...
- Putting together a list of all current interscholastic organizations and start some Email discussion – maybe go a day early to Michigan next year where this event is held and have a high school equestrian team “summit.”
  - To address issues facing equestrian high school sports
  - To discuss any potential for coming together on rules, events, etc. – at least find out what all the stumbling blocks are.
  - It seems like several states want to do this, but don’t have the personnel to get it off the ground and keep it going...cooperatively, we might be able to contribute.

#### How does this benefit OHSET?

- There are programs out there much more seasoned than us, they have a lot to share, and their input is valid and beneficial.
- The networking and recognition for our program and therefore for our athletes is invaluable.

#### **Attachment 2 – Settling Cattle for Team Penning**

For Your Consideration

- A single pen of cattle in the arena (18-27 head) with visible numbers, 3 of each number
- Herds will be settled by riders on horseback for a minimum of 3 minutes
- Cattle will be bunched in the center of the fence farthest from the pen

- Prior to starting the actual settling, the cattle will stand bunched on the fence briefly allowing them to settle down and relax (not attempting to escape).
- There will be no more than 4 line holders and only one horse and rider in the herd
- The “settler” will begin settling by arcing around the herd holding the cattle in a bunch, then they will enter the middle of the herd at an easy pace, pushing the cattle to the corner, where the line man will roll the cattle back to the herd.
- The “settler” will then repeat this on the opposite side.
- This will be repeated on each side 2-5 times depending on how wild the cattle are.
- The cattle then will be re-bunched on the fence and slowly driven (at a walk) down the arena into the pen (the back side of which is to be open).
- The cattle will be allowed to drift back to the fence, then re-bunched, then removed from the arena.
- The same procedure will be followed for all herds.
